ORDINANCE O-2014-29**

**AN ORDINANCE FINDING THAT VEHICLES ASSIGNED TO THE VILLAGE  
OF WINDHAM POLICE DEPARTMENT NO LONGER SERVE ANY PUBLIC  
PURPOSE AND AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF SAID VEHICLES AND  
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, by action taken on Resolution 2014-3 the Council of the Village of Windham has previously authorized the internet sale of unneeded, or unfit, or obsolete personal property, including motor vehicles and equipment owned by the Village of Windham; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the authority set forth in Resolution R-2014-25 the Council has authorized the purchase of three 2014 Ford Utility Interceptor All Wheel Drive Vehicles for the Village of Windham Police Department; and

**WHEREAS**, the three 2014 Ford Utility Interceptor All Wheel Drive Vehicles have been delivered to the Village of Windham and are now in service; and

**WHEREAS**, Police Chief Breiding has represented to the Finance Committee of the Village Council, and to the whole of the Council that the vehicles authorized for sale in this Ordinance are no longer needed for any Municipal purpose.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Council of the Village of Windham, County of Portage, State of Ohio, a majority or more of the members thereto elected concurring that:

Section 1: The recommendation of Police Chief Breiding is hereby accepted.

Section 2: The Council approves the sale of the following enumerated vehicles:

Ford, Crown Victoria, 2008, 2FAFP71V98X164567  
Ford, Crown Victoria, 2008, 2FAFP71VX8X154792  
Ford, Crown Victoria, 2005, 2FAFP71W65X106386

Section 3: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure, effective immediately upon its passage in order to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the Village, and for the further reason that no public purpose is advanced by the continued ownership of described vehicles, the expected proceeds from the sale of the vehicles is needed by the Police Department, the vehicles are presently stored on Village property taking up space which could otherwise be used by Village Administration, and the Village is currently insuring the vehicles and incurring an expense which will be avoided upon the sale of the vehicles.

Section 4: It is hereby found and determined that all actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Passed on first reading as an emergency on November 25, 2014.
